

The impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on students' perceptions June 2020

Overview



UCU commissioned YouthSight to **administer a survey of applicants to higher education (HE)** to better understand the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on prospective enrolment behaviour. This survey builds on recent work presented by London Economics relating to potential deferrals and students switching university

- The survey was administered between Thursday 7 May and Tuesday 12 May 2020
- The sample includes predominantly UK-domiciled students (87%) that have applied to undertake undergraduate degree level qualifications at UK higher education institutions
- The analysis is based on the UKdomiciled responses which have been weighted to be representative of the population of HE applicants in terms of gender, age category and type of school attended.

'How worried are you that the university you wish to attend will **go bust** (not have enough money to operate) because of the crisis?'

'How worried are you that the university you wish to attend will need to **make cuts** because of the Covid-19 crisis **that will negatively impact your education**?'

'How supportive would you be of moving the start of your first year of university to a later time if it meant you could have more face-to-face rather than online teaching?' 3.49
