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1. Fire regulations day of action checklist

UCU Health and Safety News has previously carried details of the important new Fire Safety Order which comes into force on October 1st. We have now written to the employers' organisations in both further education and higher education reminding them of the new requirements and advising them that UCU safety reps will be checking that the new statutory arrangements are safely in place: http://www.opsi.gov.uk/si/si2005/20051541.htm. Please note the new Fire Safety Order does **NOT** apply to Scotland or Northern Ireland, though similar arrangements may eventually be in place.

2. UCU responds to HSE consultation

UCU has made a substantial detailed response to an important HSE consultation on the current Government proposals to clarify a couple of employer duties in relation to safety reps functions, with some more general comments on the current health and safety strategy being followed by the HSE. UCU – as well as other unions including that representing HSE Inspectors – has been very critical of the Government's attempt to "lighten the regulatory load" and to place more emphasis on persuasion and education, rather than enforcement inspections. One of the consequences has been a significant cut in the number of health and safety inspections and inspectors.

Action:

If you have any comments on our response please let us know. We are considering how we can link with other unions in a more concerted effort to reverse the current shift away from "Regulation" on health and safety and any comments will help inform that work.

3. UCU National Stress Conference - November 23rd

UCU is organising a major national conference on tackling stress in further and higher education. It will take place in London on November 23rd. It will be co-sponsored by the Colleges and Universities Support Network, and will include speakers on the causes of the high stress levels in both sectors, and plenary and workshop discussions on how to tackle it. Full details will be announced in the next few days.

4. Stress Survey

UCU has just begun a major survey of members across FE and HE on stress. The survey will be used to highlight the scale and causes of stress and will inform our bargaining priorities. 9. Employers passing the buck?

UCU's Health and Safety Advice line has had two recent phone calls about employers causing considerable anxiety amongst staff by, out of the blue, announcing that in future, they will be held responsible if a student injures themselves in a class, or if they lend anything to colleague that then causes them (the colleague) injury, and they might well find themselves being sued! One person has reported that staff members have wondered if they should take out personal liability insurance.

Just to be clear. The **EMPLOYER** has the legal duty under the Health & Safety at Work Act to take care of everyone's health and safety - this applies to both staff and students.

Action:

If you had a similar experience and/or need advice on this issue please let John Bamford on our Advice Line know about any other employers who are going down this road.

10. 24/7 Annual Survey

UCU has been asked to circulate details of the 2006 '24-7' Work-life Balance Survey. This is an annual survey jointly run by the Work Life Balance Centre in Leicestershire, the Centre of Industrial Relations Keele University and Coventry University. The survey is an internet based

questionnaire which will run from 28th September to November 15th 2006.

The findings for this year's survey will be reported in February 2007.
