UCU Congress 'Green Skills' Fringe meeting

On June 1st UCU Congress a packed room of delegates heard speakers explain why sustainable development must be moved to the top of the union agenda. Iain Patten, Director of the Environment Association for Universities and Colleges (EAUC), Barbara Byrd, Apollo Alliance, USA, and Jonathan Neale, Campaign against Climate Change, stressed the urgency of local, national and international action to deliver a global low carbon economy.

Low Carbon Skills 2.

In our last issue we referred to the Government's Low Carbon Skills consultation that concluded on June 23rd. UCU made a submission which highlighted the key role that the FHE sector can play. The UCU document can be accessed at:

The government's announcement that further and higher education will face cuts in public support of up to 25% over the next three years means even more difficult times ahead. UCU research estimates that 38,000 jobs will be lost in our workplaces as a result.

Low carbon skills and training look set to be one of the few potential growth areas. That means it's even more important that we don't see the fight to save jobs as separate from the environment agenda. Branches need to put this at the centre of their plans for resisting job cuts.

3. Carbon Reduction Alliances

UCU has endorsed an initiative by Friends of the Earth to get local authorities to adopt low carbon budgets. Our view is that it provides an opportunity for unions to link up with councils, businesses, and community organisations to push for green jobs and skills. 4. Green League Table

The People & Planet Green League 2010 was published on 10 June in the Times Higher Education journal. The award-winning Green League is the only league table showing the environmental performance of Britain's universities.

More universities than ever participated in People & Planet's Green League 2010, with even more keen to take part next year. 137 were eligible for inclusion in the Green League 2010. Of these, 133 universities provided People & Planet and HEFCE with enough information to be entered into the Green League 2010.

This year People & Planet strengthened its methodology and process to make the Green League 2010 the most rigorous yet. After extensive consultation with environment managers and experts in the sector we added new criteria to measure carbon reductions, sustainable procurement initiatives and the levels and impact of student/staff engagement. UCU had pressed for the inclusion of an 'engagement' criterion. This seemed to be the best performing area. However, there needs to be a tightening up of the methodology for this criterion in 2011. http://peopleandplanet.org/greenleague

5. Climate Solidarity

The push by UCU to set up Climate Action Groups and Green Reps continues to gather momentum. We now have 30 institutions – 17 in FE and 13 in HE – where groups have been formed or are in the process of being set up. Please keep us informed of any plans you have to set up groups in 2010-11. 6. HEFCE Revolving Green Fund

A new report has been published by the Higher Education Funding Council for England. The Revolving Green Fund is actively supporting projects in the higher education sector that reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

A recent evaluation of the fund shows current projects are saving over 2 per cent of carbon emissions each year, and if projects continue at current levels and frequency the fund could lead to 8.6 per cent carbon emissions savings at universities each year by 2020.



7. Sustainable Development Alliance for Learning and Skills

UCU attended a meeting in July called by the Sustainable Development Alliance for Learning and Skills. This body will be co-ordinating the consultation which will take place in the autumn on promoting sustainable development in the FE and community learning sector. 8. Education for Sustainable Development
