Research is under greater than ever pressure to demonstrate its economic value through knowledge transfer and to become self-sustaining, while universities are encouraged to focus on the quality of their teaching and private companies move into a newly diverse higher education eco-system.

In the context of these challenges UCU and NUS believe that it is important that the sector understands what it is and what it is for. We believe that it is time to initiate a wide-ranging policy debate that goes back to fundamental questions.
