## **TUED** online learning



**TUC Education** is committed to providing a programme of high quality online courses suitable for reps who need their training to be accessible and flexible. All TUC Education online courses are delivered through a web-based learning environment called Moodle. Learners can log on for group activities whenever is convenient for them. To get the most from online learning you will need to be self-motivated, self-disciplined and organised! Unionlearn online courses include:

#### **Tackling Racism**

Starting in October 2009, the Unionlearn Tackling Racism course will give participants a better understanding of equality and diversity issues in relation to race.

It aims to provide a positive networking and learning experience, and an opportunity to contribute to developing unions' interaction with lay members within the union and workforce.

The course is delivered online and takes 18 hours to complete over eight weeks.

### TUC Diploma in Employment Law

This course will help experienced trade union reps develop their knowledge of employment law, making them more effective in their role.

The course will give reps a better understanding of the trade union approach to employment law, and enhance their ability to handle trade union and workplace issues whilst developing attitudes and skills needed for higher level study or activism.

The course is delivered online over 36 weeks spread over three terms, starting in October 2009.
