## 1. UCU Congress Environment Report 2013

UCU held a successful fringe meeting with the NUS and People & Planet on Friday, May 31st. It was called to discuss staff / student campaigns on ethical investment. It followed the debate on the motion below that was passed unanimously.

#### Better choices for a better future

This congress believes that sustainable development should be a core organising principal for the FHE and skills sector. This means moving away from treating environmentalism as a token issue or as a bolt-on to other activities. It means moving towards choices that integrate sustainability into business practice. In particular:

- 1. using the focus on employability to embed education for sustainable development across the curriculum
- 2. building divestment campaigns from high carbon portfolios. The average pension fund has 55% of its assets invested in high-carbon sectors
- *3. promoting international, national and community based campaigns that address fuel poverty and the de-carbonisation of energy supply.*

*Congress calls upon the NEC to develop a coalition of unions and students that will contribute to delivering these objectives.* 

# Congress calls upon sector employers to recognise the trade union role and establish procedures that promote embedding sustainable development.'

In September we will be publishing our review of the 2012-13 academic year. There have been plenty of developments – not all of them good. ## 2. Ethical Investment Campaign

Following the motion passed at UCU Congress in May (see above) we have wasted no time in addressing the question - Is your pension inflating the carbon bubble? UCU members attended a meeting 'Climate Change and Pensions' organised by the TUC with ShareAction, (previously Fair Pensions) the movement for responsible investment. Following the meeting we discussed an education sector strategy. This will consist of training for our trustees and intervening at meetings of the Universities Superannuation Scheme (USS), Teachers Pension Scheme (TPS) and others where UCU has membership.

## **3. Greener Jobs Alliance**

The GJA quarterly meeting on July 24<sup>th</sup> at UCU Head Office will review the current state of play on education for sustainable development. In the Further Education and Adult sector we have witnessed the closure of the Learning Skills and Improvement Service. LSIS had a very strong sustainability brief and many institutions have benefited from the support they provided. UCU would like to place on record its appreciation of the work of Conrad Benefield who led the sustainable development programme. We will be working hard with other organisations in the sector to strengthen the work of the Sustainable Development Alliance for Learning and Skills to fill the gap that has been created.

The GJA will be responding to the 'Skills for a Green Economy Report' and highlighting the skills gaps in the Government's industrial strategy. We will also



submit proposals as part of the HEFCE consultation on 'Sustainable Development in HE framework'.

## **4. Trades Union Congress**
