UCU requests statutory recognition from CU Coventry

Last Friday, UCU formally wrote to your management at CU Coventry seeking recognition under Schedule A1 of the Employment Relations Act 1992. Under this legislation, your employer now has to reply within 10 working days after which we have the option of applying to the Central Arbitration Committee and asking them to grant recognition.

We were able to do this because of the fantastic support shown for our petition by staff all over CU Coventry. We got support from every grade, every level and across every department, including support staff. There is no doubt that staff at CU Coventry want collective bargaining, not a pointless management-organised talking shop. Staff want to be taken seriously, listened to and negotiated with.

We're now a very big step closer to winning that recognition and beginning to negotiate with your employer on the issues that matter to you.

What a difference recognition makes

UCU is winning recognition right across the Coventry University Group and its associated companies. We recently won recognition at CU Services Ltd and Coventry ONCAMPUS.

Union recognition makes a real difference. For example, at the Sheffield International Study Centre, staff came together to campaign for a union and won the right to be represented by UCU. Since then they have negotiated a workload agreement are now negotiating an agreement on workloads. This is helping to make a workplace where staff feel listened to and their well-being is protected.

Here's what one UCU member had to say: "Management has been forced to listen to and communicate with staff since we gained Union recognition. It might not be acknowledged readily but even management has to recognise there have been positive outcomes which overall is producing a more humane approach to staff welfare and wellbeing." This is what can be won at CU Coventry.

Reasons to join UCU

Expert advice

When UCU members have a problem at work, they don't face it alone. They seek the union's expert advice for free.

By your side

When UCU members are involved in a disciplinary or grievance hearing, they don't face it alone. Our case workers sit alongside and represent them.

Collective strength

When UCU members want better pay or working conditions they don't have to go and argue for it alone. They work together, collectively to win and they negotiate with employers using their collective strength.

Free professional development

When UCU members want to get more out of their job they use our career enhancing Continuing Professional Development programme. While non-members pay £200 a course, UCU members get them free.
